ABOUT PAUL COOPERSMITH

After obtaining my degree in English from the University of California, Berkeley, in 1968, I took a budget flight to Luxembourg, and for six months reveled in the sights, sounds, tastes and smells of Europe. Settling in London, I spent three years researching and writing *Rule of Thumb, A Hitchhiker's Handbook to Europe & North Africa* (Simon & Schuster, 1973). Returning to Berkeley to attend graduate school in City Planning, my interest was increasingly drawn towards horticulture. I worked as a gardener, landscape contractor and designer. In 1984, combining all my interests and wanting to share what I had learned with others, I co-founded A TASTE OF BRITAIN, later to be called COOPERSMITH'S ENGLAND. Dedicated to crafting small-group garden, manor house and fine arts tours for the more independent-minded traveler, COOPERSMITH'S, as the company is now known, has received international recognition as a leader in its field.
